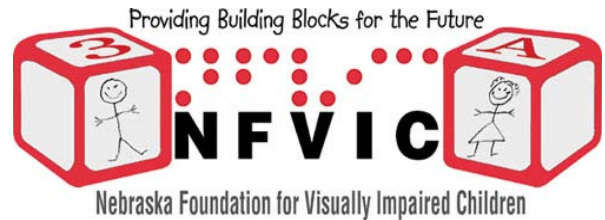

This event is part of Film Streams' Community Development Program. It is a special collaboration since NFVIC is approaching its 50th year of providing talking, large print and Braille technology and hands-on cultural events to blind children. It is the 200th anniversary of Louis Braille, the inventor of Braille at age 15. In 2005, NFVIC Board of Director Karen Sokolof Javitch and her family made an early and pivotal gift to Film Streams' Start-Up Capital Campaign, naming the Ruth Sokolof Theater in her honor. Karen's mother, Ruth Sokolof, was a Braille teacher and helped begin the NFVIC in 1960 along with the first blind pre-school in Omaha.
